Over 1000 Community Members Attend First Annual Disaster Preparedness Fair

At least 1000 residents enjoyed the first annual Fire Prevention and Disaster Preparedness Training Academy and Fair on Saturday, October 3rd from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Fire Station 8. The event included four training classes that were standing room only! Attendees earned certificates in Introduction to First Aid, Search and Rescue, Fire Safety and Suppression, and Building an Emergency Kit.

Fair participants had an opportunity to experience an 8.0 magnitude earthquake inside the earthquake simulator trailer, tour the Fire Station, learn about local hazards such as earhquakes, floods and tsunamis, how to use a fire extishguisher, how to perform lifting and cribbing for light search and rescue, and much more.

The event was spearheaded by 10 Oxnard volunteers who were all graduates of the Community Emergency Response Team Program. Costs associated with the Fair were covered by a FEMA grant as well as a number of local businesses who sponsored the event including Monsanto, Sams Club, Survivor Industries, Soteria, Sysco, 1-800-Board Up and NOAA.
