## **POST-ELECTION CEREMONY**

Oxnard welcomes newly elected officials at swearing-in ceremony



The Oxnard community welcomed three new leaders and two re-elected incumbents during a special swearing-in ceremony Tuesday, Dec. 6, 2016, at the City Council chambers.

Oscar Madrigal is the newest addition to the Oxnard City Council. The high school Spanish teacher will serve the next four years on the city council after winning an extremely tight race. He replaces outgoing Councilmember Dorina Padilla.

Michelle Ascencion is the new city clerk who worked for eight years as a city clerk in Ventura County prior to being elected. She will serve a four-year term, replacing Daniel Martinez.

Phillip Molina, the new city treasurer, has 25 years of experience as a finance director and treasurer. He will also serve a four-year term.

Mayor Tim Flynn was re-elected to the City Council's top spot and will serve another two-year term, and Councilman MacDonald will retain his seat for another four years.

#### **Outgoing City officials bid farewell**





After 24 years of service to the Oxnard community, Daniel Martinez made his final public statement as city clerk. "I have to thank my family, loved ones and friends," said Martinez. "I especially would like to thank the staff because I couldn't do my work without the hard dedication and efforts of the staff here within the city. I really appreciate that." Martinez also thanked voters for trusting and voting for him several times throughout his career.

Outgoing Councilmember Dorina Padilla bid adieu to the Oxnard community after completing her first term in office. "You provided me with the opportunity to do one of the hardest things I've had to do in my life, and that was to provide the city with a vision for its future," said Padilla. "I tried to do so in a way that was objective and rational and that always put the residents as the number one priority." She also thanked the city council, city administration and staff. She expressed gratitude for family and friends who supported her during her time on the council.

# Revised schedule for NRG Energy application released

The California Energy Commission released a revised schedule for the NRG Oxnard Energy Center, LLC application for a 262-megawatt (MW) natural-gas-fired powered generation facility, the Puente Power Project (P3).

The project is proposed at 393 N. Harbor Blvd. in the City of Oxnard. Highlights for the Energy Commission's revised P3 schedule include:

- Dec. 8, 2016: Final Staff Assessment (FSA) published
- · Jan. 13, 2017: Parties file opening testimony
- Jan. 20, 2017: Parties file rebuttal testimony
- Feb. 6, 2017 (week of): Evidentiary hearings
- May 2017: Energy Commission final decision

Smoking ordinance goes into effect Dec. 20, 2016 Ordinance No. 2908 regulating smoking at indoor and outdoor areas will go into effect Tuesday, Dec. 20, 2016.

The new regulations prohibit smoking (including vaping) of any type of combustible substance in/at:

- Dining areas
- Public events
- Recreational areas
- Service areas
- Inside all facilities owned, leased or controlled by the City of Oxnard
- Within a reasonable distance (25 feet) from any area where smoking is prohibited



The smoking ordinance also requires any owner, operator, manager or other person in control of a non-smoking area to post "No Smoking" or "Smoke-free" signs in a conspicuous place at each:

- Point of ingress to the non-smoking area, and
- in at least one other conspicuous point within the area.

The signs are required to have letters of no less than 1 inch in height and include the international "No Smoking" symbol, which consists of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a red bar across it.

#### Winter warming shelter open for 2016-17 season, donations and volunteers needed



The West Ventura County Regional Winter Warming Shelter (WWS) is open seven days a week from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. at the Oxnard National Guard Armory, 351 S. K St. It is anticipated that the shelter will remain open through March 2017, pending additional funding.

The cost to operate and staff the shelter is \$80,000 per month. To date, the cities of Oxnard and Ventura have committed \$69,000 and \$73,000 respectively, and the Ventura County Board of Supervisors authorized \$120,000 to help defray the costs of operating the shelter. At least \$80,000 in additional

resources are needed to keep the shelter open through March 2017.

Monetary donations can be sent to the Downtown Ventura Organization, P.O. Box 1414, Ventura, Calif. 93002. The non-profit organization is the fiscal agent for the regional consortium operating the shelter.
