Recycle during month of November to receive cash back



Help us reduce, reuse and recycle our way to a cleaner, more eco-friendly tomorrow by bringing your cans for recycling to the Del Norte Regional Recycling and Transfer Station's Buy Back Center, 111 S. Del Norte Blvd.

For every pound of California Refund Value (CRV) aluminum cans recycled, you will receive a special redemption value of \$1.67 during the month of November. The Buy Back Center is open from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Saturday. There is a CRV limit of 100 pounds per day (not valid for licensed recyclers).
