WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

Measure B


If approved, would amend Oxnard City Code to:

- Prohibit elected City officials and Planning Commissioners from accepting gifts from lobbyists or contractors
- Impose contribution limits on candidates running for Mayor, City Council, City Clerk or City Treasurer
- Require posting of specific City contracts and financial reports on City's website
- Update term limits for the City Council and Mayor, and change the Mayor's term from two to four years



PROHIBIT ELECTED CITY OFFICIALS AND PLANNING COMMISSIONERS FROM ACCEPTING GIFTS FROM LOBBYISTS OR CONTRACTORS

- ✓ Makes Oxnard's ethical standards clear.
- ✓ No one is beholden to anyone else.
- Prevents seeking contracts or gaining favor through gifts.







PROHIBIT ELECTED CITY OFFICIALS AND PLANNING COMMISSIONERS FROM ACCEPTING GIFTS FROM LOBBYISTS OR CONTRACTORS



Measure B <u>does not</u> impact your ability to communicate with your elected officials.

You are free to contact your local representatives with your ideas and opinions.





MEASURE B | WHAT IT IS....

IMPOSE CONTRIBUTION LIMITS ON CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL, CITY CLERK OR CITY TREASURER

- Will impose campaign contribution limits for the first time in Oxnard.
- Contribution limits help remove the risk and the perception that elected officials are beholden to their contributors.
- In cities without limitations on contributions, candidates sometimes raise more than 40% or more of their total campaign funds from a single contributor.*
- In recent years, there have been examples of \$50,000, \$100,000, and even \$244,000 contributions to candidates for local office from donors with business before that local government. Such massive campaign contributions create a serious risk of actual or perceived corruption.*

IMPOSE CONTRIBUTION LIMITS ON CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL, CITY CLERK OR CITY TREASURER



Measure B does not restrict your First Amendment rights.

Individuals may still make a contribution of \$500 to candidates for City Council and \$750 to candidates for Mayor.

It still allows independent expenditures for political communications by individuals, corporations, nonprofit corporations, labor unions, and other associations, as well as loans to yourself.



REQUIRE POSTING OF SPECIFIC CITY CONTRACTS AND FINANCIAL REPORTS ON CITY'S WEBSITE

- City is correcting past problems with new financial reporting.
- City's new interactive website will go beyond state financial reporting requirements and provide additional transparency to residents.
- Measure B locks in financial reporting requirements so that future City Councils or City Managers cannot undo them.

REQUIRE POSTING OF SPECIFIC CITY CONTRACTS AND FINANCIAL REPORTS ON CITY'S WEBSITE



Measure B <u>does not</u> limit financial reporting by the City.

Measure B compliments state law requirements and the Sunshine Ordinance.

It requires posting all contracts going to City Council, contracts above \$200K, and all labor contracts.







UPDATE TERM LIMITS FOR THE CITY COUNCIL AND MAYOR, AND CHANGE THE MAYOR'S TERM FROM TWO TO FOUR YEARS

✓ Sets Councilmember and Mayor's term limits to 3 four-year terms

✓ Allows experienced local government candidates to run for Mayor.





UPDATE TERM LIMITS FOR THE CITY COUNCIL AND MAYOR, AND CHANGE THE MAYOR'S TERM FROM TWO TO FOUR YEARS



Measure B is not protecting incumbents.

Measure B does impose term limits. It's up to voters to decide if they want to limit the Mayor and Council to two or three consecutive terms in office.



MEASURE B | SUMMARY

Measure B does not give the City any additional powers, but simply gives voters the option of expanding ethics protections, transparency, and fiscal accountability.


- Measure B increases transparency by requiring additional opportunities for the public to monitor and review government spending and decision-making.
- Measure B updates term limits to three (3) four-year terms.
- Measure B also prohibits councilmembers and commissioners from accepting gifts from lobbyists or City contractors, preventing special interest influence in city decision-making.
- Measure B imposes campaign contribution limits for elected officials for the first time in Oxnard.
